**Regular Meeting
March 14, 2022

The Police Jury of the Parish of Catahoula, State of Louisiana, met in Regular Session at its regular meeting place, the Police Jury Meeting Room at the Courthouse, on Monday, March 14, 2022 at 6:00 P.M.

Present: President Harold Sones, Vice President Jerel Evans and Jurors Brady Nelson, Deborah McCormack, Rodney Sones, Jeffery Estes, Rickie Crumpton, Debra Hawkins and Johnnie Adams; Secretary/Treasurer Patti C. Mizell, Assistant Secretary Frankie Tolar, Sanitation Department Manager Tammie Edwards, Road Supervisor Charles Atkins and Attorney Karla Shirley-McHand.

Absent: None

A quorum being present, the Police Jury of the Parish of Catahoula, State of Louisiana, was duly convened as the governing authority of said parish by President Harold Sones, who called upon Rodney Sones for Prayer, and requested that the Jurors and the public remain standing for the Pledge of Allegiance after which the following business was transacted.

On motion by Johnnie Adams, seconded by Rodney Sones and unanimously passed, the Jury voted to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the last meeting and adopt same as published in the Official Journal.

On motion by Rodney Sones, seconded by Jeffery Estes and unanimously passed, the Jury voted to open the Public Hearing to discuss adoption of ordinance with penalty for theft of parish road signs.

Brad Borth asked the Jury why this ordinance is necessary as there are laws against theft. President Sones stated that the Jury felt it may would help deter theft of parish road signs with addition of a local ordinance.

Leo Chapelle requested the proposed ordinance be read aloud to the public. Secretary/Treasurer Patti C. Mizell read as follows:

AN ORDINANCE TO BECOME EFFECTIVE MARCH 15, 2022 TO IMPOSE A FINE FOR THEFT OR TAMPERING WITH CATAHOULA PARISH ROAD SIGNS.

WHEREAS, road signs are very important to our citizens; and

WHEREAS, road signs are much needed in any emergency situation; and

WHEREAS, if road signs are not up for emergency personnel, valuable time could be lost trying to locate someone in dire need of assistance; and

WHEREAS, replacing these signs is very costly to the Parish and taxpayer;

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, that the Catahoula Parish Police Jury will impose a fine up to \$500.00 and 30 days in the parish jail if anyone is caught tampering with or stealing road signs.

Dorothy Oliver asked if the amount of fine and or jail days would be dependent upon the number of signs stolen. Attorney Karla McHand stated that it would be.

Ellis Boothe inquired about being in possession of stolen road signs. Attorney Karla McHand stated there is a law for possession of stolen property.

There being no further public comments, on motion by Jerel Evans, seconded by Rickie Crumpton and unanimously passed, the Jury voted to close the Public Hearing.

On motion by Rodney Sones, seconded by Debra Hawkins and unanimously passed, the Jury voted to add the following item to the agenda:

Approve Town of Jonesville request for grader service in the town.

On motion by Jerel Evans, seconded by Debra Hawkins and unanimously passed, the Jury voted to approve the agenda.

President Sones opened the Public Comment Period for items on the agenda. There were no public comments.

Mr. Harold Cowan, Maitland Water Board, was not present.

Ms. Dorothy Oliver, Maitland Water Board, stated that the board would like to have a status update for the purchase of generators through the LCDBG-DR grant funds.

President Sones stated that Thomas Magee, Frye Magee, LLC would address this matter.

Mr. Magee stated that the project includes two generators each for municipalities of Jonesville, Harrisonburg, Sicily Island and two for Maitland Waterworks. He stated the locations for Town of Jonesville had just been received last week and Heath McGuffee, project engineer, is working on the necessary documents and reviews to enable this to go out for bid. It will be 60-90 days before project will be ready to go out for bid. The bid process from bid approval by the Jury, bid publication and bid award would take approximately one month depending upon jury meeting dates. This bid will be published in the local newspaper. He stated total time from now to bid award would be 3-4 months. After award, then it will depend upon delivery time before installation can begin and this could possibly be up to a year for delivery.

On a motion by Jerel Evans, seconded by Rodney Sones and unanimously passed, the Jury voted to authorize payment of current invoices approved by the Finance Committee.

There were no additions or deletions to Selective Maintenance.

On motion by Deborah McCormack, seconded by Debra Hawkins and unanimously passed, the Jury approved 200 yards of pit run for Old Columbia Road.

On motion by Jeffery Estes, seconded by Jerel Evans and unanimously passed, the Jury approved 200 yards of pit run and 18x20 culvert for Cypress Road.

On motion by Deborah McCormack, seconded by Rodney Sones and unanimously passed, the Jury approved a 24x30 & 18x30 culvert and 100 yards of pit run for Connie Lane.

On motion by Deborah McCormack, seconded by Rodney Sones and unanimously passed, the Jury approved the engagement with Bosch & Statham for 2021 E911 financial statement.

Item #17 & #18 were tabled. President Sones stated that there is some language that needs to be clarified in the proposed Hometown Waste garbage contract. Scott Slover, attorney for Hometown Waste will re-draft proposal this week.

President Sones stated that a Special Meeting will be held on Monday, March 21, 2022 at 10:00 A.M. to bring these two items back to the jury for approval.

On motion by Deborah McCormack, seconded by Rodney Sones and unanimously passed, the Jury approved the purchase of 2500 96-gallon garbage carts from Cascade Engineering, Inc. to be piggy backed for the Franklin Parish Police Jury bid.

On motion by Debra Hawkins, seconded by Jerel Evans and unanimously passed, the Jury approved the request from the Town of Jonesville for use of grader.

Financial Reports were presented to the Jury for the month of February 2021 which included budget to actual.

On a motion by Rickie Crumpton, seconded by Johnnie Adams and unanimously passed, the Jury voted there being no further business to adjourn.

**Special Meeting
March 21, 2022

Proceedings of a Special Meeting of the Catahoula Parish Police Jury on Monday, March 21, 2022 at 10:00 A.M.

Present: President Harold Sones and Jurors Brady Nelson, Deborah McCormack, Rodney Sones, Jeffery Estes, Rickie Crumpton and Johnnie Adams; Secretary/Treasurer Patti C. Mizell and Sanitation Department Manager Tammie Edwards.

Absent: Vice President Jerel Evans and Juror Debra Hawkins

A quorum being present, the Police Jury of the Parish of Catahoula, State of Louisiana, was duly convened as the governing authority of said parish by President Harold Sones called upon Johnnie Adams for Prayer, and requested that the Jurors and the public remain standing for the Pledge of Allegiance after which the following business was transacted.

On motion by Rickie Crumpton, seconded by Jeffery Estes and unanimously passed, the Jury approved the agenda.

President Sones opened the floor for public comments on agenda items.

Howard Hardie asked who owns the new company. President Sones stated it is Doug Atkins with Hometown Waste out of Concordia Parish.

Mr. Hardie also questioned the number of residents in the parish. President Sones stated if you count houses, it would be close to 3500. This number and the previous year's tonnage of waste are taken into consideration for companies to give a price. There are currently around 2300 bills being sent out.

Leo Chapelle asked if the contract was put out for bids. President Sones stated that it was not. This is considered a service and does not have to be bid. The Jury contacted several companies and obtained prices. Hometown Waste gave the best price and service terms.

President Sones stated Hometown Waste is going to furnish a dumpster to be placed at the maintenance barn for bulky waste and white goods. Residents will be given a trash cart which the truck will pick up, but residents can also have up to six extra bags in another can beside the parish cart.

Mr. Hardie inquired about places such as Parhams Bend – were these places included. President Sones stated there were a few areas that got missed for billing in the beginning, but most all residents should now be receiving

a bill.

Mr. Chapelle asked if there was anything the Jury would like for the public to know about this service.

President Sones stated he would like for the public to know that this matter has been worked on for months. This isn't something that has happened quickly and the jury was trying to obtain the best price and the best service for our parish.

Mr. Chapelle asked about the issue of residents who do not pay the garbage fee but pay sales tax. A discussion was held on this subject. The Jury passed the garbage fee ordinance which is to supplement the sales tax. The sales tax does not bring in enough revenue some months to pay the waste company.

On motion by Brady Nelson, seconded by Rickie Crumpton and unanimously passed, the Jury approved a letter to Metro Service Group, Inc. terminating the residential garbage contract upon expiration of current contract July 1, 2022.

There has been one change to the draft proposal from Hometown Waste in Section 2.4. Below in parenthesis has been added:

Parish will not contract with any other person or entity to provide for any services that are provided for in this agreement (for the remainder of the current contract period).

On motion by Deborah McCormack, seconded by Rodney Sones and unanimously passed, the Jury approved a 5-year contact with Hometown Waste of Catahoula Parish, LLC for residential garbage pick-up and disposal beginning July 1, 2022.

On motion by Brady Nelson, seconded by Rodney Sones and unanimously passed, the Jury voted to adjourn.
